Joko-ji Temple

5 minutes by taxi from JR Obama Station

Joko-ji Temple was founded in 1630 by Eisho-ni, also known as Jotoku-in Eisho-ni, the wife of Takatsugu Kyogoku. Eisho-ni passed away in Edo (Tokyo) and was buried at Jotoku-ji Temple alongside her attendant. The main hall was destroyed by fire in 1923, and the main gate suffered the same fate in 1964. Reconstruction began in 1990 and was completed in 2001. Within the temple grounds, there are valuable portraits, a graveyard, and a study with wall paintings. The silk-painted portrait of Takatsugu Kyogoku's wife is designated as a cultural asset of the Fukui prefecture.

Kuin-ji Temple

5 minutes by taxi from JR Obama Station

Wakasa guardian Takeda Motomitsu built Goseyama Castle and relocated the guardian's mansion to its foothills. The present-day Kuin-ji Temple stands on this site, which continued to be used as the guardian's mansion through the Warring States period. Takatsugu Kyogoku, who became the lord of Wakasa Province for his achievements in the Battle of Sekigahara, inherited this area and established Kuin-ji Temple. Later, it became the family temple of the Obama domain's Sakai family and was renamed Kuin-ji Temple in honor of Sakai Tadakatsu. It is known as the family temple of the Sakai family of the Obama domain and is famous for having a cave where the legendary Yao Bikuni is said to have entered nirvana.
